1. Homework:

Please let me know if, for any reason at any time throughout the year, a problem arises with the homework sent home so that we can communicate concerns and make any necessary changes. Completing homework should not be a struggle between you and your child. For reading, please have your child write down the book title, then you can initial it and add any pertinent comments. Grade 3s: Homework should not take anymore than **30 minutes** each night and please do not go over this time frame unless your child wants to finish something and is not feeling overwhelmed.

Grade 2s: Includes: reading, spelling and math. Homework should take **20-25 minutes** per night **at the most** and consists of review and practice of the concepts which have been worked on in class throughout the previous weeks.
